

# Who Are Kinship Families?

#### **Kinship Children**

- 2,832,000 kinship care children (Federal Interagency Forum on Child and Family Statistics, 2019)
- 2,733,000 children living with kin and non-relatives (Federal General Accounting Office (GAO) Report 2020
- 133,405 children in kinship foster care, 33% of all foster care children (Federal Adoption and Foster Care Reporting System 2019)

According to an Annie E. Casey 2012 report:

- One in ten of all children will live with a grandparent or other relative caregiver during their childhood
- One in five of all Black children will live with a grandparent or other relative caregiver during their childhood
  - Despite challenges, kinship children do as well or better on many well-being measures in comparison to foster children

## **Kinship Children**

According to the Federal Interagency Forum on Child and Family Statistics, 2019):

- 1.7 million grandparent caregivers
- 651,000 live with other relatives
- 481,000 live with nonrelatives who are not foster parent children

#### **Kinship Caregivers**

According to the federal General Accounting Office Report 2020:

- 1,697,193 grandparent caregivers
- 677,784 relative caregivers
- 358,023(non-relative caregivers
- Kinship caregivers are more likely to be:
  - o poor
  - o single
  - o older
  - o less educated
  - o unemployed

(Annie E. Casey, 2012; Rubin et all, 2017; Generations United, 2017)

o close to 40% of caregivers have clinically high levels of stress (Lee et al, 2016)

## **Kinship Caregivers Who Are Grandparents**

• 2. 7 million grandparents are primary caregivers for children living in their homes (U.S. 2010 Census)



# Helping Non-Parent Caregivers Achieve Permanency For Children All Across New York

- About one third of grandparents are raising children in homes without a parent present (Ellis & Simmons, 2014)
- Grandparent caregivers are more likely to be women than men (GAO, 2020)
- Grandparents make up approximately 63% of all non-parent caregivers of children (Federal Interagency Forum on Child and Family Statistics, 2019; GAO 2020)
